THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION

The National Football Foundation is a nationwide educational organization in a broad, yet very significant sense. It enlists the ex-player, educator, athletic director and coach, the football official, writer, and commentator, and the football fan in the service of American youth. It strives to promote football as an integral and wholesome part of the educational process, to inculcate ideals of sportsmanship into the mind of the spectator as well as that of the player; and to encourage the most beneficial direction and playing of the game at schools and colleges throughout the nation.

To achieve these aims the National Football Foundation seeks to establish the true concept of football and to gain recognition for the significant role the game plays in the preservation and advancement of the American way of life. This is done through publication of relevant information, awards and fellowships granted for post-graduate study to college seniors who have outstanding football ability, academic achievement, and campus leadership during their undergraduate years, and by honoring in the Football Hall of Fame those college players and coaches whose deeds and lives during and after their playing and coaching days have been exemplary and inspiring.

THE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The permanent Football Hall of Fame will be built at New Brunswick, New Jersey, near the field where the first intercollegiate game was played (1869) between Princeton and Rutgers. It will be football's national shrine where the game's heritage will be preserved and its honored names immortalized.
