THE PURPOSES OF THE FOUNDATION

The National Football Foundation is a nation-wide organization whose purposes are:

- (1) to promote American amateur football as an integral and wholesome part of our educational processes;
- (2) to encourage the beneficial direction and playing of the game at schools and colleges throughout the country;
- (3) to provide the proper incentives and ideals for American youth and set standards of sportsmanship for the individual player.

The Foundation seeks to establish the true concept of the game as an amateur sport, and to gain recognition of the important role it plays in the preservation and advancement of our way of life. It endeavors to achieve these goals:

- (1) by disseminating substantive information through its own publications and the other printed media and voices that reach the public;
- (2) by honoring by election to the Hall of Fame those players and coaches whose deeds and lives during and after their playing days have been exemplary and inspiring;
- (3) by honoring through various types of awards the outstanding scholar-athletes in high schools and colleges;
- (4) by rendering many practical and valuable services to colleges, schools, institutions, organizations and individuals connected with football.

The Los Angeles Chapter of the National Football Foundation in one of its endeavors to accomplish these high purposes has established the Paul Schwegler Memorial Scholarship Fund to award scholarships to outstanding graduating high school scholarathletes.

The Scholarship Fund is named in honor of the late Paul Schwegler. He was an All-American in 1931 and 1932 at the University of Washington; one of that University's all time great tackles. Paul Schwegler was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame in 1967. He was a founding member of the Los Angeles Chapter of the National Football Foundation, and served as the Chapter President in 1967-69. The great success of the Los Angeles Chapter is due in great part to his unceasing efforts in its behalf.


The scholarship award is for one academic year to the four-year college of the recipient's choice. However, the scholarship may be renewed for the next school year at the option of the Scholarship Fund upon application of the recipient, if he has maintained the required high scholastic standard in the prior academic year. The maximum length of the scholarship to any one recipient is for a period of four individual years of undergraduate college work.

The number of scholarships awarded each year will be determined by the National Foundation Scholarship Committee.




